An Easter Thought John 18:1-14

The crisp night air probably chilled everyone who had reason to be out in the darkness and they were few in number. One's breath was visible and the flames of torches sent twisted columns of smoke into the dark sky.

The Last Supper was done. The disciples' feet had been washed by their Master/Servant. Prayer alone was the last preparation for what lay ahead. That Prayer was done in a familiar place, the garden called Gethsemane across the Kidron Valley just outside one of the city gates.


